Average Weight is the average value of the holding relative to the portfolio's total assets over the period. Return on Equity is a profitability measure that represents return on average total equity for the period. Holdings are summarized at the portfolio level using weighted average. Net Debt/Equity is a financial leverage measure that represents total net debt as a percentage of total equity for the period. Holdings are summarized at the portfolio level using weighted average. Dividend Yield is the aggregate weighted average of the portfolio's equity holdings and their respective dividend yield.
