Holdings are summarized at the portfolio level using weighted average. **Net Debt/Equity** is a financial leverage measure that represents total net debt as a percentage of total equity for the period. Holdings are summarized at the portfolio level using weighted average. **Dividend Yield** is the aggregate weighted average of the portfolio's equity holdings and their respective dividend yield.
