Average Weight is the average value of the holding relative to the Fund's total assets over the period. Price to Book is a valuation measure that represents the price divided by the book value per share. Holdings are summarized using harmonic average. Forward Price/Earnings Ratio is a valuation measure that represents the price at quarter end divided by the mean earnings per share (EPS) consensus estimate for the next twelve months as of the run date. The holdings are summarized at the portfolio level using weighted harmonic average and exclude negative earnings. Return on Equity is a profitability measure that represents return on average total equity for the period. Holdings are summarized at the portfolio level using weighted average.
